NATIONAL TEAM HIGHLIGHTS:

2014: Averaged over 24 minutes per game in exhibition games against Brazil while averaging 9 points, 5.7 rebounds and 1 assists per game...averaged over 21 minutes, 5.5 points per game and was also 4th in the Czech tournament with 4.5 rebounds per game...Led the team in total points at FIBA worlds with 62 and was second on the team in total rebounds with 30

2013: Played in 19 International games on the Senior Women's team averaging 9.5 points and 25.85 minutes per game in exhibition play. Participated in the 2013 FIBA America finals and helped qualify Canada for FIBA Worlds 2014 ...Lead the team in rebounds averaging 7.2 per game and averages 11.33 points and 26.67 minutes per game and also made All-Tournament Team for FIBA Americas 2013.

2012: Played in all 5 games for the SWNT in the Olympic Qualifying Tournament helping the team to qualify and averaging 23.4 minutes and 6.6 points per game...Member of the 2012 Olympic team that qualified for the quarter-finals in London, where she finished 9th overall in points per game and minutes played as well as 2nd in field goal shooting and three pointers.

2011: Participated in all 6 games at the FIBA Olympic Qualifiers in Colombia with the Senior Women's National team... 1st in 2 point field goals, 2nd overall field goal shooting, and 8th overall in 3 point field goals. Played with the senior national team in 2 exhibition games vs. Puerto Rico. Played her 100th game as part of the National Team Program on May 28, 2011 against Spain in an Exhibition Tournament in Spain... In the first phase of training camp, averaged 10.0 points and 8.0 rebounds in 3 games in the Spanish Tournament. Averaged a team-high 18.0 points per game and 6.0 rebounds in an exhibition tournament in France... In the second phase of training camp, averaged 11.3 points in a three-game series versus Japan, in Japan and 14.3 points per game in three games against China, in China.

2010: Averaged 30 minutes, 13 points and five rebounds per game during the Women's World Championships in Czech Republic...Ranked top 15 in points per game in the tournament and in free throw made... Led the team in scoring, 2nd in rebound and 4th in assist in the tournament...

2009: Averaged 27.8 minutes and 6.8 points per game during the FIBA Americas Champion where Canada earned a berth to the 2010 World Championships... Also pulled down 4.4 rpg at that tournament

2007: Played in all 5 games for the SWNT in the Olympic Qualifying Tournament, averaging 9.8 points, 6.4 rebounds, and 27.4 minutes per game.

2006: Joined Team Canada at the World Championships after playing in the WNBA Championship... Started in all eight games of the FIBA World Championship logging 28.1 minutes avg per game... Averaged 9.8 points and 5.9 rebounds, while shooting .468 from the floor... Led Canada with 18 points and added eight rebounds vs. China, September 20.

2005: Played in all five games for Canada in the FIBA Americas Qualifier logging 23.8 minutes avg per game... Second in team scoring with 13.6 points placing her seventh in the tournament... Also, seventh in the tournament with seven three-points shots made and fifth in three-point percentage .389... Made 15 free-throws placing her in eighth place for the tournament... Started in all three games against Puerto Rico averaging 10.0 points in 23.6 minutes... Shot .454 from beyond the arc and averaged 4.7 rebounds... Played in all five games at the Jogos Eletrobos Tournament averaging 18.6 minutes and 7.0 points... Shot .667 from the field... UNIVERSITY HIGHLIGHTS:

SENIOR (2005-06): Led her team to a Mountain West Conference Championship and finished in the Elite 8 of the NCAA Tournament... Named a Third-Team All-American... Second NCAA Division I women's basketball player to earn her conference's player of the year award four times... Honorable mention member of the Kodak/WBCA All-America team... Finished Mountain West Conference and Utah career leader in scoring with 2,281 points... Finished her career with 1,015 rebounds making her just the second Ute ever to compile more than 2,000 points and 1,000 rebounds and first Mountain West player ever to hit the 2,000/1,000 marks...
